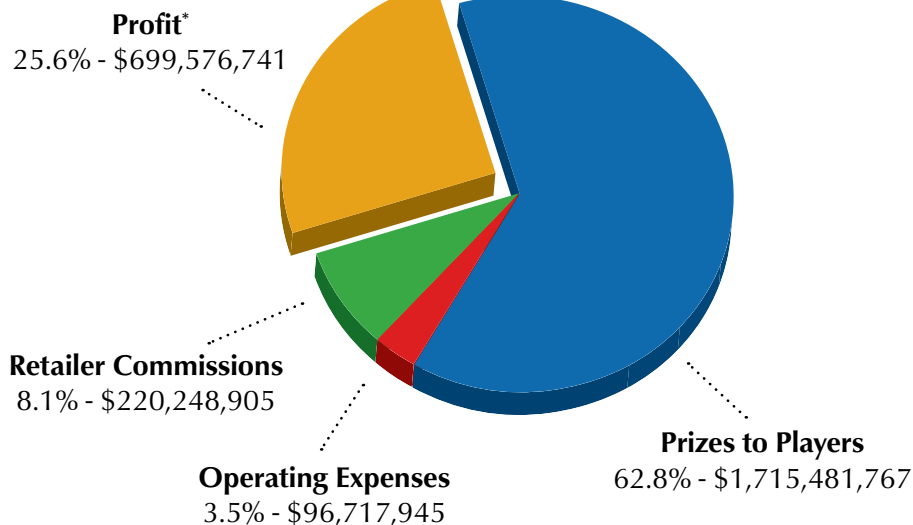

Lottery FY2024 Facts & Figures

- Profit to the State: \$699.6 Million**
 A decrease of 2.1% from the FY2023 total of \$714.3 Million
 Includes \$657.4 Million to the General Fund, up 0.9% from FY2023
- Total Sales: \$2.732 Billion**
 A decrease of 1.2% from the FY2023 total of \$2.764 Billion
 Scratch-off sales were \$1.061 Billion, surpassing \$1 Billion for the third consecutive year
 The Lottery's 11th draw game, CASH POP, launched on May 6, 2024
- Player Prizes: \$1.715 Billion**
 A decrease of 1.0% from the FY2023 total of \$1.733 Billion
 An average of nearly \$4.7 Million per day
 1,808 prizes of \$10,000 or more, including 33 prizes of at least \$1 Million
- Retailer Sales & Cashing Commissions: \$220.2 Million**
 An increase of 0.2% from the FY2023 total of \$219.9 Million
 An average retailer commission of nearly \$51,000

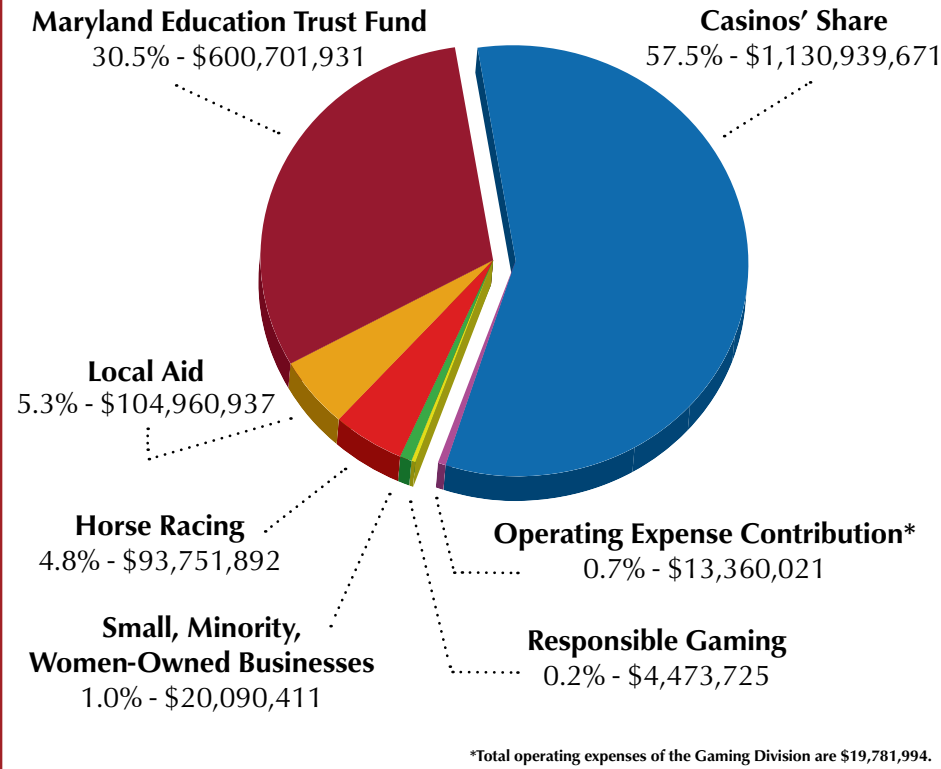

Casino FY2024 Facts & Figures

Maryland's casinos contribute portions of slot machine and table game revenue to the Maryland Education Trust Fund; local aid for the communities and jurisdictions where the casinos are located; the horse racing industry; and Maryland's Small, Minority and Women-owned Business Fund.

- **Casino Gaming Revenue: \$1.964 Billion**
A 4.7% decrease from the FY2023 total of \$2.060 Billion
- **Contribution to the State: \$824.0 Million**
A 2.8% decrease from the FY2023 total of \$848.1 Million
- **Contribution to the Education Trust Fund: \$600.7 Million**
A 3.5% decrease from the FY2023 total of \$622.7 Million
- **Local Aid Contribution: \$105.0 Million**
A 3.7% decrease from the FY2023 total of \$108.9 Million
- **Horse Racing Contribution: \$93.8 Million**
A 1.7% increase from the FY2023 total of \$92.1 Million
- **Small, Minority, Women-Owned Business Fund Contribution: \$20.1 Million**
A 1.2% increase from the FY2023 total of \$19.9 Million
- **Problem Gambling Fund Contribution: \$4.47 Million**
A 0.2% decrease from the FY2023 total of \$4.48 Million
Casinos pay annual assessments of \$425 per slot machine and \$500 per table game

Sports Wagering Definitions

- **Handle:** Amount players wagered, including promotional wagers provided by sportsbooks
- **Prizes:** Winnings paid to players
- **Hold %:** Percentage of the handle remaining after prizes are paid
- **Other Deductions:** Includes federal excise tax and loss carryforward
- **Taxable Win:** Amount remaining after sportsbooks pay winners and deduct promotional play and other amounts
- **Contributions to the State:** 15% of the taxable win, contributed to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund
- **Promotional Play:** Deductible amount of complimentary play provided to customers by sports wagering operators

Sports Wagering FY2024 Facts & Figures

- Sports wagering contributions to the state go to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund, which supports public education programs
- Expired sports wagering prizes are paid to the Problem Gambling Fund and totaled \$985,862 in FY2024
- 13 retail and 12 mobile sportsbooks operated during FY2024, up from 10 retail locations and 10 mobile sportsbooks during FY2023
- FY2024 was the first time mobile sports wagering was active for a full fiscal year

Fantasy Competition FY2024 Facts & Figures

The operators of fantasy competitions (including daily fantasy sports) contribute 15% of their revenue to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund. In FY2024, total fantasy competition revenue was \$6,558,792, distributed as follows:

- Operators' Share: \$5,574,973 (85%)
- Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund: \$983,819 (15%)

Racing and Community Development Facilities Fund Transfers

In FY2024, Maryland Lottery and Gaming received \$5 Million from the Horse Racing Purse Dedication Account, \$3.5 Million from the Pimlico Community Development Authority and \$10,761,268 from the Racetrack Facility Renewal Account, totaling \$19,261,268. Per the Racing and Community Development Act of 2020, the \$19,261,268 was then allocated as follows: \$17 Million to the Racing and Community Development Facilities Fund and \$2,261,268 to the General Fund.
