All Lottery retailers are authorized to cash winning tickets up to \$600; Expanded Cashing Authority (XCAP) retailers can cash tickets up to \$5,000; Winning tickets up to \$25,000 can be cashed without appointments at all Maryland casinos.

IV. SPECIAL PROJECTS

 In 2020, the Maryland General Assembly passed the <u>Built to Learn Act of 2020</u> authorizing the MSA to issue up to \$2.2 billion in debt for the construction of public school facilities throughout the state. The Built to Learn Act took effect pursuant to February 12, 2021 General Assembly override of Governor Hogan's veto of 2020 Senate Bill 1000 / House Bill 1300, the Blueprint for Maryland's Future – Implementation. Because the capital improvements projects will be funded by gaming revenues, the Maryland Lottery & Gaming Control Agency is assisting the Maryland Stadium Authority in the Series 2024 debt service preparations. Note that we participated in the previous Built to Learn Revenue Bonds, Series 2021 and Built to Learn Revenue Bonds, Series 2022A financings. It is expected that the Series 2024 financing will close on October 30, 2024.

• The department's Special Projects Manager is a loaned executive for the 2024 Maryland Charity Campaign (MCC) which launched in October, 2024. This is the 4th year for this manager's participation. The campaign will end December 31, 2024. To raise awareness of this year's campaign, the Agency's MCC team has already had one fundraising event, "Grill and Chill." The goal is to exceed last year's collection amount.
