V. **SPECIAL PROJECTS**

In 2024, the legislature passed the HB 1524 Racing Facility Ownership and Construction - Racing Operations legislation. The legislation authorizes the MSA to issue \$400 million in bonds to demolish and reconstruct Pimlico and to build a new training facility at a site chosen by the Maryland Thoroughbred Racetrack Operating Authority (MTROA).

The Authority's Comprehensive Plan of Financing Plan of the Racing Facilities Capital Improvements – Pimlico, Series 2025 is expected to issue up to \$250 million of taxable revenue bonds. It was approved by the Authority's Board of Directors on October 7, 2025.

Because the capital improvements projects will be funded by lottery revenues, the Maryland Lottery & Gaming Control Agency is assisting the Maryland Stadium Authority in the debt service preparations. The department and other Agency personnel have been participating in the compilation and review of documents required for the bond offerings; assisting the credit rating agencies in the determination of the credit rating for this offering through presentation of various Lottery information to the rating agency personnel; and participating in the due diligence conducted by the Underwriter in connection with the issuance of the bond.
