Maryland Lottery and Gaming generated \$1.637 Billion to support state programs in Fiscal Year 2026.

The Maryland Lottery, the State's six casinos, sports wagering and fantasy sports provide funding for a wide range of vital State programs and services, including schools and public health and safety initiatives.

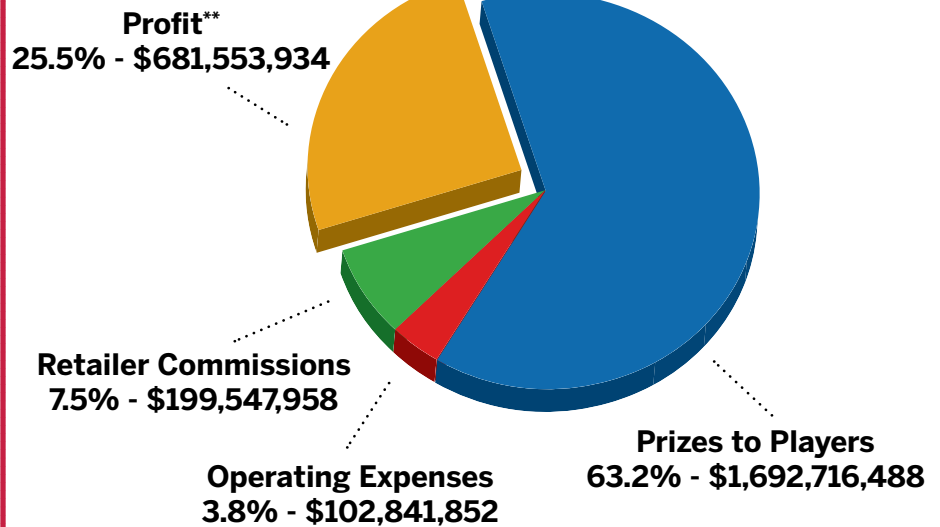

Lottery FY2026 Facts & Figures

The Maryland Lottery continued its growth in FY2026:

- **Profit to the State: \$681.6 Million**
Third-best total in the Maryland Lottery's 53-year history
- **Total Sales: \$2.676 Billion**
Third-best total in Maryland Lottery history
Scratch-off sales surpassed \$1 Billion for the fifth consecutive year
- **Player Prizes: \$1.692 billion**
An average of nearly \$4.6 Million per day
1,659 winning tickets paid \$10,000 or more, including 28 that paid at least \$1 Million
- **Retailer Sales & Cashing Commissions: \$199.5 Million**
Average commissions of more than \$47,000 per retailer

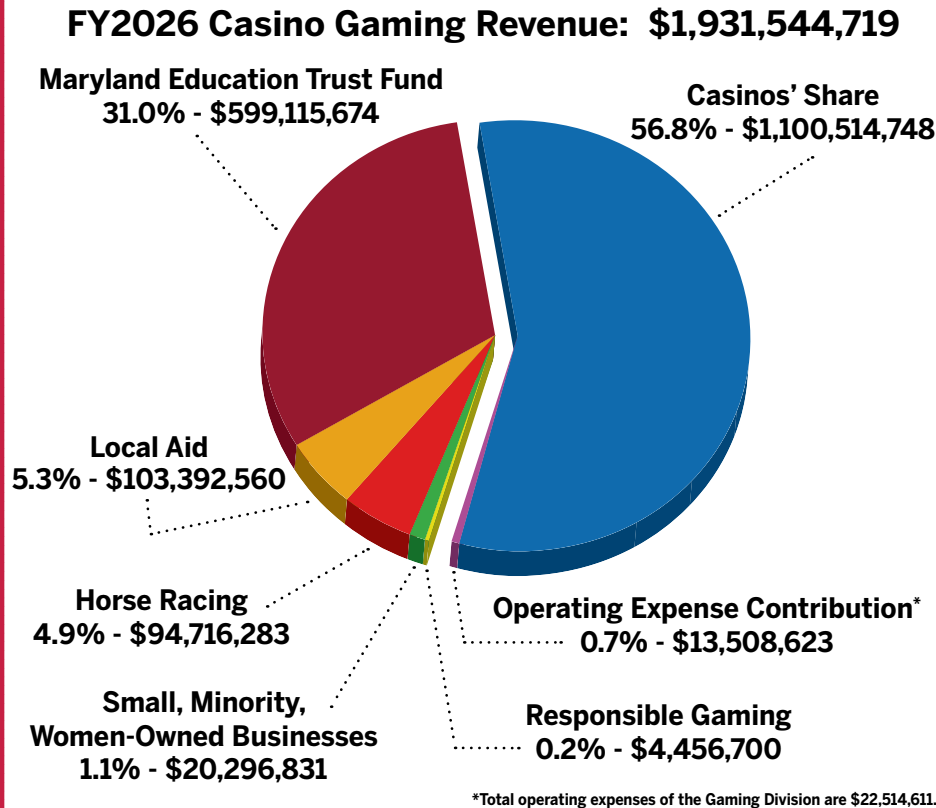
CASINO GAMING FY2026

Casino FY2026 Facts & Figures

Maryland's casinos contribute portions of slot machine and table game revenue to the Maryland Education Trust Fund; local aid for the communities and jurisdictions where the casinos are located; the horse racing industry; and Maryland's Small, Minority and Women-owned Business Fund.

- **Casino Gaming Revenue: \$1.931 Billion**
Fifth-best performance in the 16-year history of Maryland's casino program
- **Total Contribution to the State: \$822.2 Million**
Fifth-best total in casino program history
- **Contribution to the Education Trust Fund: \$599.1 Million**
Cumulative casino contributions to education since 2010 are more than \$7 Billion
- **Local Aid Contributions: \$103.4 Million**
Includes contributions to local impact grants and local jurisdictions
- **Horse Racing Contributions: \$94.7 Million**
Includes contributions to Racetrack Facility Renewal and Purse Dedication accounts
- **Small, Minority, and Women-Owned Business Fund Contribution: \$20.3 Million**
Cumulative contribution of more than \$172 Million since 2010
- **Problem Gambling Fund Contribution: \$4.4 Million**
Casinos pay annual assessments of \$425 per slot machine and \$500 per table game

Sports Wagering Definitions

- **Handle:** Amount players wagered, including promotional wagers provided by sportsbooks
- **Prizes:** Winnings paid to players
- **Hold %:** Percentage of the handle remaining after prizes are paid
- **Other Deductions:** Includes federal excise tax and loss carryforward
- **Taxable Proceeds:** Amount remaining after sportsbooks pay winners and deduct promotional play and other amounts
- **Contributions to the State:** The portion of operators' taxable proceeds that was directed to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund and the General Fund.
- **Promotional Play:** Deductible complimentary play provided to customers by sports wagering operators.

Sports Wagering FY2026 Facts & Figures

- **Retail operators:** 15% of taxable proceeds directed to education programs supported by the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund.
- **Mobile operators:** 15% of taxable proceeds directed to the Blueprint; 5% directed to the General Fund.
- Expired prizes paid to the Problem Gambling Fund in FY2026: \$1,098,225.

Fantasy Competition FY2026 Facts & Figures

The operators of fantasy competitions (including fantasy sports) contribute 15% of their proceeds to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund. In FY2026, total fantasy competition proceeds were \$6,862,126, distributed as follows:

- Operators' Share: \$5,832,809 (85%)
- Blueprint for Maryland's Future Fund: \$1,029,320 (15%)

Racing and Community Development Facilities Fund Transfers

In FY2026, Maryland Lottery and Gaming received \$5 Million from the Horse Racing Purse Dedication Account, \$3.5 Million from the Pimlico Community Development Authority, and \$10,823,168 from the Racetrack Facility Renewal Account, totaling \$19,323,168. Per the Racing and Community Development Act of 2020, the \$19,323,168 was then allocated as follows: \$13.4 Million to the Racing and Community Development Facilities Fund and \$5,923,168 to the General Fund.
