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12 A. Placement; Limitations.

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14 (1) Subject to surveillance requirements in COMAR 36.03.10.11 and 36.03.11.04, a
15 facility operator may place automated teller machines on the gaming floor within the
16 facility.

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18 (2) Gaming Floor. The proximity of an automated teller machine to a video lottery
19 terminal or table game that is on a gaming floor is subject to the following limitations:

21 (a) An automated teller machine may be placed no closer than 10 feet to a video
22 lottery terminal or table game; and

24 (b) There may be no more than one automated teller machine for every 125 video
25 lottery terminals and table game seats.

27 B. Withdrawal Limits. The **Exclusive of transaction fees or surcharges, the** maximum amount
28 that a player may withdraw from an account by using an automated teller machine **located on**
29 **the gaming floor** shall be **is**:-

31 ~~(1) No more than \$250 per transaction; and~~

33 ~~(2) No **no** more than \$1,000 **\$2,500** per gaming day.~~

35 C. Negotiable Instruments Prohibited.

The proposed amendment to § B of this regulation would increase the ATM withdrawal limit per gaming day, remove the individual transaction limit for ATMs located directly on the facility operator's approved gaming floor, and clarify that the withdrawal limit does not include transaction fees or surcharges imposed on a player by a bank or ATM provider.

1 (1) In this regulation, “negotiable instruments” means an electronic benefit card, debit
2 card, or similar instrument issued by the Department of Human Resources for the purpose
3 of accessing temporary cash assistance.

5 (2) An automated teller machine may not accept a negotiable instrument.
