6 **.07 Automated Teller Machines.**

7 A. Placement; Limitations.

8 (1) Subject to surveillance requirements in COMAR 36.03.10.11 and 36.03.11.04, a facility
9 operator may place automated teller machines on the gaming floor within the facility.

10 (2) Gaming Floor. The proximity of an automated teller machine to a video lottery terminal
11 or table game that is on a gaming floor is subject to the following limitations:

12 (a) An automated teller machine may be placed no closer than ~~10~~ 7 feet to a video lottery
13 terminal or table game; and

14 (b) There may be no more than one automated teller machine for every 100 video lottery
15 terminals and table game seats.

16 B. Withdrawal Limits. Exclusive of transaction fees or surcharges, the maximum amount that a
17 player may withdraw from an account by using an automated teller machine located on the
18 gaming floor is no more than \$2,500 per gaming day.

19 C. Negotiable Instruments Prohibited.

20 (1) In this regulation, “negotiable instruments” means an electronic benefit card, debit card,
21 or similar instrument issued by the Department of Human Services for the purpose of accessing
22 temporary cash assistance.

23 (2) An automated teller machine may not accept a negotiable instrument.

The proposed amendment would reduce the distance between an ATM and a video lottery terminal or table game to 7 feet.
