For April 26, 2018 Commission. The proposed amendments would implement Ch. __, Acts 2018 (HB 1171 Reconciliation of Proceeds), which was passed during the 2018 session of the Maryland General Assembly to amend the definition of "proceeds" in SG § 9-1A-01(u). The Commission is now required to adopt regulations that allow a video lottery operation licensee to reduce the amount of proceeds when a video lottery operation licensee returns to successful players more than the amount of money bet through video lottery terminals or table games for up to seven following days. This law takes effect July 1, so these amendments should be designated as both emergency and non-emergency.

- (b) If the total difference described in C(2) of this regulation exceeds the amount of proceeds for the following consecutive gaming day, continue to subtract the remaining difference after the first day for up to one additional consecutive gaming day.
- (4) A facility operator may not subtract losses pursuant to C(3 2) of this regulation for more than two seven consecutive gaming days.



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
