13 M. At the end of each gaming day or at least once each gaming day, as designated by the facility
14 operator and approved in advance by the Commission under COMAR 36.05.03.16, and at other
15 times as may be necessary:

16 (1) Except as provided in § M(2) of this regulation, A a security department employee
17 shall collect and sign all envelopes or containers with damaged decks of cards, decks of
18 cards required to be removed that gaming day and all extra decks in the card reserve with
19 broken seals and return the envelopes or containers to the security department;

20 (2) If an alternative procedure for collecting, destroying or cancelling a deck of
21 cards described in § M(1) of this regulation has been submitted to, and approved by,
22 the Commission, a security department employee:

23 (a) Shall collect all envelopes or containers and return them to the security
24 department; and

25 (b) May sign the envelopes or containers; and

26 ~~(2)~~ (3) A supervisor or above may collect all extra decks with intact seals in the card
27 reserve.

The proposed amendment would make optional the present requirement that a security department employee sign an envelope or container containing a damaged deck of cards, deck of cards required to be removed that gaming day, and all extra decks in the card reserve with broken seals, if the deck is to be destroyed or cancelled the same day it is collected. The purpose of this amendment is to allow facilities to propose alternative methods of documenting the collection of cards from gaming tables based on their operations.
