18 19	(2) An applicant or licensee shall remit payment to the Commission within 30 days after the date of the invoice or order to pay.
20	C. Reconciliation of proceeds.
21	(1) In reconciling proceeds as described in this section, a facility operator shall
22	account for video lottery terminal proceeds separately from table game proceeds.
