3 Chapter 06 Enforcement of Voluntary Exclusion Program

4 Authority: State Government Article, §9-1A-24(e), Annotated Code of Maryland

6 .03 Voluntary Surrender.

7 **A. In this regulation, the following term has the meaning indicated.**

8 **B. Term defined. “Unredeemed item”:**

9 **(1) Means a token, voucher, check, ticket, chip, coupon, or similar item that has**  
10 **monetary value, and that a player has:**

11 **(a) Won by playing a video lottery terminal or table game;**

12 **(b) Inserted into a video lottery terminal;**

13 **(c) Played at a table game; or**

14 **(d) Received by converting cash, check or wire transfer at a video lottery**  
15 **facility;**

16 **(2) Does not mean cash.**

17 **C.** An individual who applies to be placed on the voluntary exclusion list may contractually  
18 agree to:

19 ~~A. (1) Redeem or liquidate all an unredeemed ~~items~~ item with monetary value that the individual~~  
20 ~~has received since being placed on the voluntary exclusion list; and~~
